Walking Tour of 2025-2026 Sculptures, MCEP Art Trail, Mount Clemens & Clinton Township

Park your car in MCEP's fenced parking lot at **92 Northbound Gratiot**. As you walk out the driveway you will see the **FIRE BUSH (1)**, the first piece of art on your Sculpture Walk. You will also find a box on the MCEP porch with a paper copy of the directions and photos of the titled works. From MCEP building, walk south on the east side of NB Gratiot.

Your second sculpture will be just north of **66 NB Gratiot**, entitled **GEOMETRIC CONSTRUCTION** (2). Could you make one?

Keep walking south to the northeast corner of **NB Gratiot and Robertson**. See **CONFESSIONS (3)** – any private thoughts? Let us all resolve to do better. Look across **NB Gratiot at the northwest corner** to see **THE FENCE (4)**. Please use the light to cross over to the west side of the street.

Keep walking south on the west side of **NB Gratiot between Kibbee & Robertson** you will see **THE DETROIT WINDMILL**, a patented design (5). We hope it will be a breezy day.

Walk south to the **NW Corner of Inches St. and NB Gratiot**. This vacant lot was purchased by MCEP. We are developing it into "Pollinator Park." Take a seat and a selfie with one of our pollinators – **BUTTERFLY ON MILKWEED (6), HAWK MOTH (7),** and **BEE (8)**. Sit and enjoy the Tulip Poplar trees and the many native plants that are labeled for your identification. **BEE READER (9).** Open the Bee Reader's mouth and find new paperback booklets that are easy to read for young and mature readers. Return monthly for new booklets. Also find three-3D **PRINTED PLANTER SCULPTURES (10, 11, 12)**. Our first venture in 3D printed sculpture. Feel the texture of them; from a distance look at the implied motion.

Continue walking south on NB Gratiot to find our friends BEREA HORSE (13), CHARLESTON HORSE (14), and DASH (15) at Shadyside Park. If you cross the street to see them up close, go to the corner and please watch for traffic. Do not ride the horses – they are wild!

Continue south on NB Gratiot across the Clinton River via the bridge to the south bank of the river which hosts the **BONIOR TREE (16)**. You are now in Clinton Township! Read the story on the plaque of an outstanding former Member of Congress. Enjoy the many native plants that will bloom in this garden each season if our resident ground hogs do not eat them first.

Ah, MUSIC BOX (17). You will need to listen to the music inside and find it! Look for the music box. Where is it? Search for it.

Standing in front of the Bonior Tree cross at the light to the northwest corner of **SB Gratiot & Wellington Crescent** to **GOLF BIRDS** (18). Affectionately known as the "Gire Geese", these birds enjoy the grass so be careful where you step.

Now heading north on SB Gratiot, staying on the same side of the road as the Geese; cross over the bridge to the **corner of Belleview and SB Gratiot** for **AUTUMNUS II** (19).

Still continuing north to **278 SB Gratiot** and you will arrive at **JIAN'S WING (20)**. Consider leaving a small rock there with a prayer.

Take a rest on the bench at **276 SB Gratiot** and enjoy an expanded micro garden supported by volunteer gardeners while viewing **SQUAWK A LOT (21)**.

Since you have had a rest, now you can enjoy the dance of **ETERNAL SPRING II (22)** at **260 SB Gratiot**. She's beautiful and has micro garden flowers dancing, too. Thank you again, micro garden volunteers!

Continue further north and just past the shops of **Gratiot Plaza** and you will find **INTERNATIONAL PEACE (23)** depicting the Japanese art of paper folding.

Continue north and cross at the light at SB Gratiot and Robertson going east to S. Main Find DOYEN (24), going south on S Main looking right back at you. Scream a lot and let it all out.

Take a few more steps **south on S. Main** and view **MOUNT CLEMENS OBELISK (25)**. Every city needs an obelisk just like Rome and Alexandria. Where? Continue across the circle south to **235 SB Gratiot**, for a bouquet of **BLUE ROSE (26)** for your effort. After you enjoy the flowers, turn north and retrace your steps to S. Main and Robertson.

Go north on the west side of S. Main to 176 S. Main to have a SOLAR ORBIT (27). Then next at 166 S. Main delight in our town as "we are rising" on the WINGS OF THE PHOENIX (28).

Main** see **HENS & CHICKS (29)**. Then next just past **140 S. Main** to **FLEUR A POIS (30)**. DO NOT PICK THE FLOWERS! At **126 S. Main** a vision of night flowers in black and white, **NIGHT LILY (31)**. Flowers come in all sizes, colors, and time of day or night.

Walk further north on the east side of south Main to **100 S. Main** and see the restful peacocks, **ELUSIVE COURTSHIP** (32), both sides now.

Then it's back south to cross at the light at S. Main and Church, where you will find PESCADOS (33), which has found a permanent home at 115 S. Main St. Rest on the bench here and enjoy the garden the church always maintains so beautifully.

Keep north on the east side of the street to **99 S. Main** to enjoy **TO BEE OR NOT TO BEE (34)**. Kudos to Jennifer Gale for planting the beautiful garden surrounding this permanent sculpture!

Just north at **93 S. Main** you will find a **BOX OF FLOWERS (35)**. Smell the flowers and repeat your steps south to the light at S. Main and Church. Cross Church St. going south to **165 S. Main**, make sure your glasses are on tight for **OCULAR DREAMS (36)**

Aha! I know you think we missed some. NO! Just follow directions.

Now turn around and walk north on same side of the street and stop at **155 S.**Main where you will be greeted by PEACOCK NOUVEAU (37). A 3-year effort has produced yet another micro garden here for our peafowl to play in thanks to community volunteer efforts. Native plants are highlighted along with horticultural favorites.

Just north of the Post Office at **133 S. Main** you will find **ENDLESS SUMMER (38)**. Here is another chance to take a rest on a bench and give thanks for the many health workers who service our community! Next door at **127 S. Main** you will find mighty **WHIMSEY (39)**.

Go to the intersection of Church St. and S. Main and end up at the northwest corner and k walk to SB Gratiot. Cross SB Gratiot at the light. Head north on the west side of SB Gratiot and come upon a marvel of ancient and modern technology, **DETROIT WINDMILL**, a patented design (40), which powered for centuries early technology and we are now coming to believe it will power a lot of our energy needs in the future. A few steps further north you will meet the **LADIES IN RED (41)** who are waiting **near the driveway entrance to Mount Clemens High School on SB Gratiot**.

Remember all these steps bring health and sculptures to life.

Continue north on SB Gratiot to Cass Avenue. Cross Cass Avenue at the light to see SHORTJAW CISCO (42) in front of First United Methodist Church of Mount Clemens. Did you know that Shortjaw Cisco is an endangered Michigan species?

By walking east on Cass, crossing at the light over SB Gratiot, do not miss a look at COUNTY SEAT (43), across the street near the soon to be Mount Clemens City Hall at the southeast corner of Cass Avenue and Walnut Street.

Continue on **Cass to Main Street**. Look up and discover our history found in the great sculpture work on the **OLD COUNTY BUILDING (44)** - granite busts of military figures—a soldier, a sailor, a marine, and an airman (selected in deference to nearby Selfridge Air Base)—and of a Native American and a Revolutionary War soldier. Spandrels carved with zigzags flank the sculptures. Bronze plaques at the entrances depicting a sower, a surveyor, a seaman, and a farmer commemorate the early industries and occupations of Macomb County.

Cross Main Street to the east side and go north to the **plaza between the Old County Building and the Court Building**. Another added discovery, not put there by us, but by a community group in 1970 is the **BUST OF PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY (45)**.

Continue walking north on Main Street to the front **40 N. Main Street** to view the sculpture of **ALEXANDER MACOMB (46)**, who Macomb County was named after. This sculpture was placed here by a different community group in 1976 as part of the bicentennial.

Use the crosswalk in front of the Alexander Macomb statue to go to the west side of Main Steet where you will be met by **Rotary Park** with two sculptures: **BOY & DOG (47)** and **FLAMES OF LIFE (48).** Thank you to the Mount Clemens Rotary.

Then walk one block north to **73 N. Main** to the sculpture of the **CLOCK** (49). Who placed the clock here? The names are written on it. Thank you, Gabe Anton, for leading the effort to get the clock.

Turn around and go south on Main Street, stopping to get a drink or something to eat along the way. Cross at the light to end up at the southeast corner of NB Gratiot and Crocker (notice the streets change names). Go south on the east side of NB Gratiot to the MCEP parking lot at 92 NB Gratiot, where you started.

Thought you were done? There are still five more sculptures that will be easier to visit by car.

Turn right out of the MCEP driveway and stay in the right lane. Turn right on Crocker Blvd. (traffic light) and proceed across the bridge. Turn right onto Amvet Drive which curves left and becomes Riverside Drive. Al Hebert, a local artist and retired Professor at Macomb Community College, created TEMPLE (50) at 34 Riverside Drive.

Go back to Crocker Blvd. and turn left. Continue onto Cass Avenue. Just before the railroad tracks turn right onto Grand Avenue. Your next stop is at the Michigan Transit Museum at **200 Grand Avenue**. The **BIG BOY (51)** sculpture is out front of the Michigan Transit Museum. Knock on the door and visit the museum if it is open (michigantransitmuseum.com).

Once you return to your vehicle, go east along New Street to SB Gratiot where you will turn right.
